

# Life Lesson Presentation: Scoring Guide

1.) Organization

- 4 points – Clear organization, reinforced by media. Stays focused throughout.
- 3 points – Mostly organized, but loses focus once or twice.
- 2 points – Somewhat organized, but loses focus three or more times.
- 1 point – No clear organization to the presentation.

2.) Content: Relevance

- 4 points – Incorporates relevant life guidelines into presentation and adequately explains.
- 3 points – Incorporates several life guidelines into presentation, but does not incorporate key concepts which are relevant to presentation.
- 2 points – Incorporates one or two life guidelines into presentation. Some concepts discussed are not relevant to topic.
- 1 point – Life guidelines are not integrated into presentation or are not appropriately integrated.

3.) Quality of Media

- 4 points – Media supports the presentation and is easy to understand. If slides are used, they contain no spelling or grammatical errors.
- 3 points – Media provides some support for the presentation but portions are off topic. If slides are used, some contain too much information or have illegible font. One or two spelling or grammatical errors are present.
- 2 points – Half of the media does not support the presentation. Half of the slides contain too much information or have illegible font. Three to five spelling or grammatical errors are present.
- 1 point – Media is mostly off topic with a slight relevance to the topic. If slides are used, they are not effective. More than five spelling and grammar errors exist.

4.) Eye Contact and Use of Note Cards

- 4 points – Maintains effective eye contact and uses note cards only as a reminder.
- 3 points – Eye contact is utilized as are note cards, but occasionally notes cards are used too much or eye contact is not utilized enough.
- 2 points – Eye contact is used infrequently, and note cards are read from often.
- 1 point – Eye contact is rarely used and note cards are read from to deliver the presentation.

5.) Voice Quality, Pace

- 4 points – Voice is clear, easy to hear and understand. Speaker enunciates. Pace is neither too fast nor too slow. Tone is conversational.
- 3 points – Problems exist with either enunciation or pace, but these problems occur for **less** than 20% of the speech. Tone is usually conversational and less than 20% of the speech is either monotone or read.
- 2 points - Problems exist with either enunciation or pace, and these problems occur for **more** than 50% of the speech, but not more than 80% of the speech. Tone is conversational at least 20% of the time.
- 1 point – Voice is not clear, hard to hear and understand. Speaker mumbles. Pace is either too fast or too slow. Tone is rarely conversational.

6.) Time

- 4 points – 7-9 minutes
- 3 points – under 7-6 minutes
- 2 points – under 6-4 minutes
- 1 point – under 4-2 minutes
